# About University

In 1974-75 the University of Sindh with its solitary campus in Jamshoro, could not keep pace with the growing need of the Sindh Province for higher education. Another campus was therefore set up at Khairpur Mir's named after the great international poet of Sindh, Shah Abdul Latif Bhittai. The campus was meant to provide higher education facilities in various modern and scientific fields to the people in the northern part of the Province of Sindh, which had a rich tradition of producing highly educated and intelligent people. On 16th March, 1986, the Sindh provincial assembly passed an act to make the campus a full-fledged and independent university. The act came into force in 1987, making the university functional, under then Chief Minister.

This campus covers an area of 307 acres of lush green lawns, playgrounds and trees. The landscape includes three canals nearby which serve as picnic spots for the students and the faculty. Shah Abdul Latif University, Khairpur is located in the heartland of Upper Sindh, i.e. Khairpur, a former state that joined Pakistan in 1955. The main campus is located near National Highway and is easily reachable by Air, Railway & Bus services. The Sukkur Airport, is one of the biggest Airports of Upper Sindh, is on half an hour drive and Khairpur Railway station is 5 km away from the main campus.



By bringing quality education closer to these communities, SALU is playing a crucial role in empowering the youth of these regions, fostering academic growth, and promoting gender equality in education. This initiative reflects the university's commitment to addressing regional disparities and supporting the advancement of underserved populations.


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# ORGANIZATIONAL CHART OF SHAH ABDUL LATIF UNIVERSITY, KHAIRPUR






### Bs (4-Year) Students Enrollment 2023-24



They must be involved in civic education. The curriculum may be devised at university level for local government system. Currently, it is limited to some departments. Youth policy prepared by the Govt. of Sindh may be implemented in letter and spirit. Transfer of powers from provincial government to local government may be made. Political parties may provide many opportunities for youth to take part in local and general elections. Women and transgender may be given space in the electoral process. Youth may be given space in civil defense, PDMA and NDMA so their confidence building could be enhanced. District Finance Commission may be devised to share the due budget to the local governments. The Rural Development Academy and local government academy may be established on the pattern of Sindh Rural Development Academy in every Divisional Headquarters for the capacity building of the councilors.





The media person may visit relief camps frequently to oversee the relief activities, conducted by the line departments. The Media laws and ethics be adhered so the scare, fear may not erupt among the masses. The media persons during the disaster may coordinate with the meteorological department to get accurate forecast and disseminate to the masses. They revealed that in the wake of flood havoc 2022, 33 million people were adversely affected even 12 million people are facing safe drinking facility, 2 million Childrens are confronting malnutrition problem.





- This section calls the meetings of the bodies and prepares the Agenda and Working Papers.
- The Meetings Section announces the Minutes of the meetings and arrange to note the follow-up actions on various decisions of the bodies.
- The section maintains the files of all the bodies regarding their formation, elections and other routine proceedings.

## **BRIEF FUNCTIONS AND ROLE OF THE GOVERNING BODIES:**

### **Senate.**

The Senate shall have the powers, to consider the drafts of Statutes proposed by the Syndicate, to consider and pass the annual report, annual statement of accounts and revised budget estimates; to delegate any of its powers to an Authority or Officer or a Committee or Sub-Committee; and to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Statutes.

### **Syndicate.**

The Syndicate shall be the executive body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act and the statutes, exercise general supervision over the affairs of the University and the management of its property.

### **Academic Council:**

An academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provision of this Act and the Statutes, have the power to lay down proper standards of instruction, research, and examinations and to regulate and promote the academic life of the University and the colleges.

### **Advance Studies and Research Board (ASRB).**

The ASRB shall advise the Authorities on all matters connected with the promotion of advanced studies and research in the University; to propose Regulations regarding the awards of research degrees; to appoint Supervisors, to recommend panels of foreign/local experts etc.

### **Board of Faculty**

To recommend the prescribed courses of studies the syllabi and the outlines of tests for all University examinations to make such other regulations i.e., the discipline, teaching, lectures, and classes in the departments of the Faculty. (ii) The syllabuses, study courses, examinations, examiners, division of grants and other matters that concern the departments of the Faculty. (iii) Regulations concerning the courses, curricula, exemption from subjects and examinations that concern the Faculty. (iv) Which subjects and departments should fall under the Faculty. Any other matter the Faculty Board judges to be in the interest of the Faculty.



## **Board of Studies**

To advise the authorities on all academic matters connected with instruction, research and examination in the subject or subjects concerned. To propose curricula and syllabi for all degree, diploma and certificate courses in the subject or subjects concerned; and to suggest a panel of names of paper setters and examiners in the subject or subjects concerned.

## **Finance and Planning Committee.**

The FPC shall recommend/consider the annual statement of accounts and the revised budget estimates to the Syndicate including all matters relating to planning, development, finances, investments, and accounts of the University.







### 3. Video Conference Room

### 4. Campus Management Solution (CMS)


