

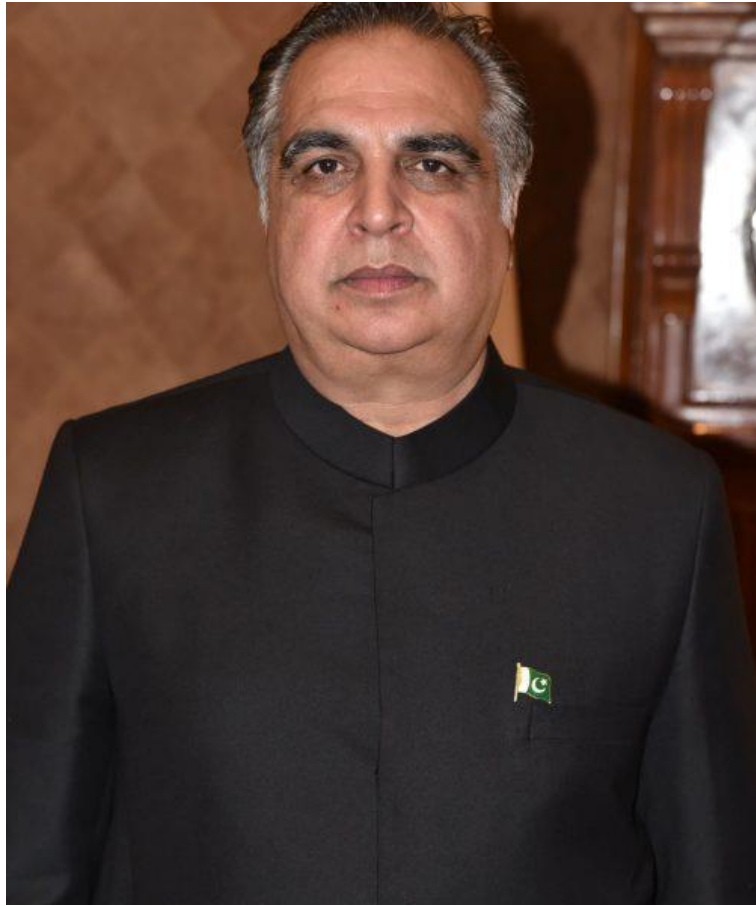

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

In 1974-75 the University of Sindh with its solitary campus in Jamshoro, could not keep pace with the growing need of the Sindh Province for higher education. Another campus was therefore set up at Khairpur Mir's named after the great international poet of Sindh, Shah Abdul Latif Bhitai. The campus was meant to provide higher education facilities in various modern and scientific fields to the people in the northern part of the Province of Sindh, which had a rich tradition of producing highly educated and intelligent people.

On 16th March, 1986, the Sindh provincial assembly passed an act to make the campus a full-fledged and independent university. The act came into force in 1987, making the university functional, under then Chief Minister. Its campus covers an area of 307 acres of lush green lawns, playgrounds and trees. The landscape includes three canals nearby which serve as picnic spots for the students and the faculty.

Shah Abdul Latif University, Khairpur is located in the heartland of Upper Sindh, i.e. Khairpur, a former state that joined Pakistan in 1955. The main campus is located near National Highway and is easily reachable by Air, Railway & Bus services. The Sukkur Airport, is one of the biggest Airports of Upper Sindh, is on half an hour drive and Khairpur Railway station is 5kms away from the main campus.

The beauty of Shah Abdul Latif University, Khairpur lies in the fact that it is surrounded by famous Archaeological Sites: Mohenjo Daro, Kot Diji fort, Rohri Hills, Nara Desert, religious shrines of Sadhu Bello, Shrine of Hazrat Sachal Sarmast, barrages and bridges (Lloyds Barrage and Lanes Down) and Oil & Gas Fields (OMV, Sawan Field & Kadan Wari).

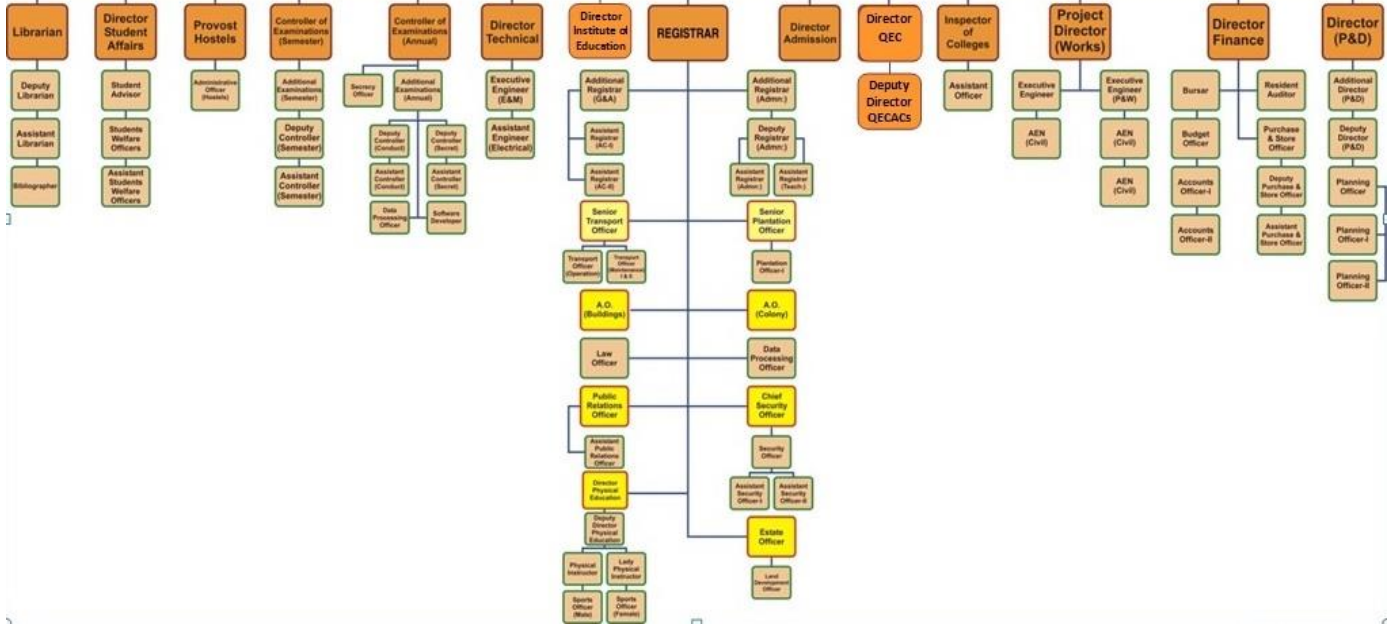

ORGANIZATIONAL CHART OF SHAH ABDUL LATIF UNIVERSITY, KHAIRPUR

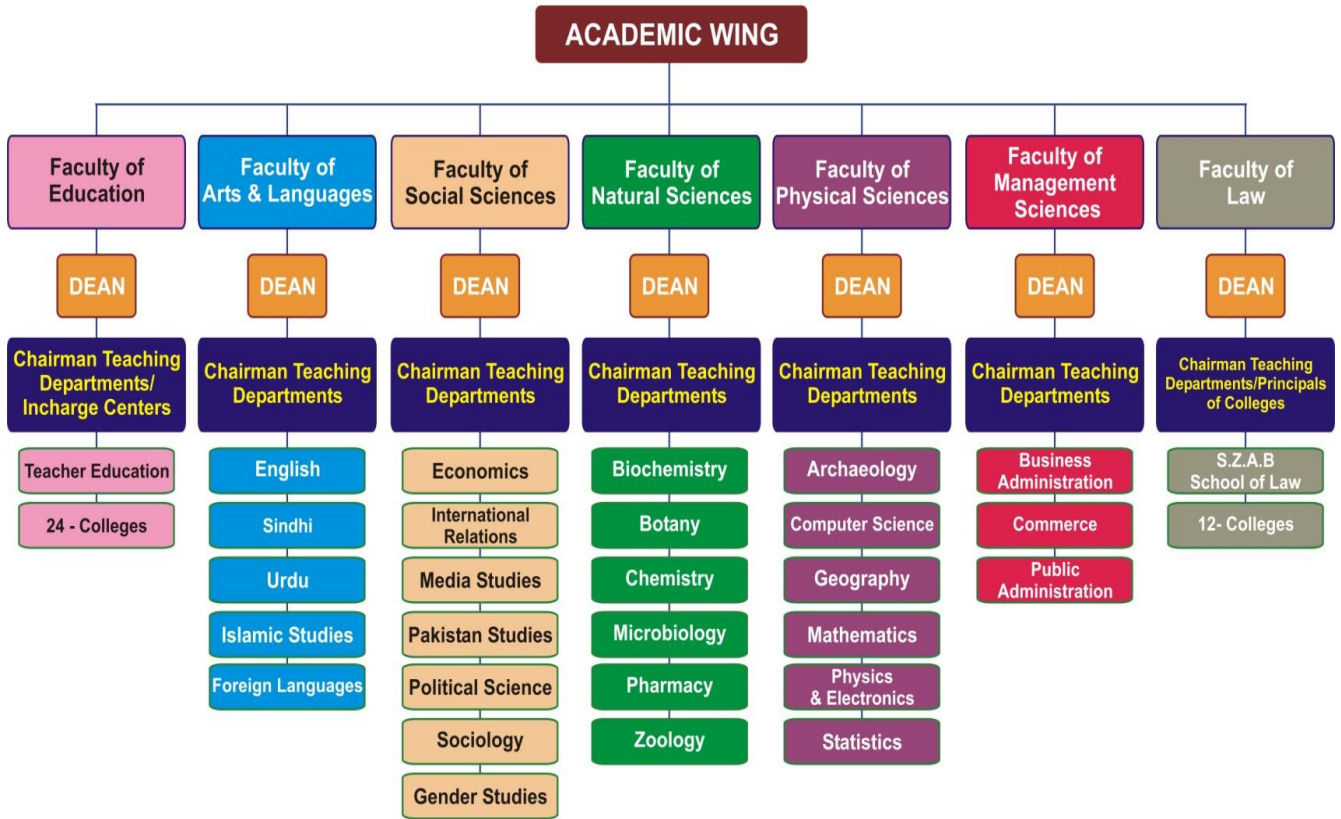


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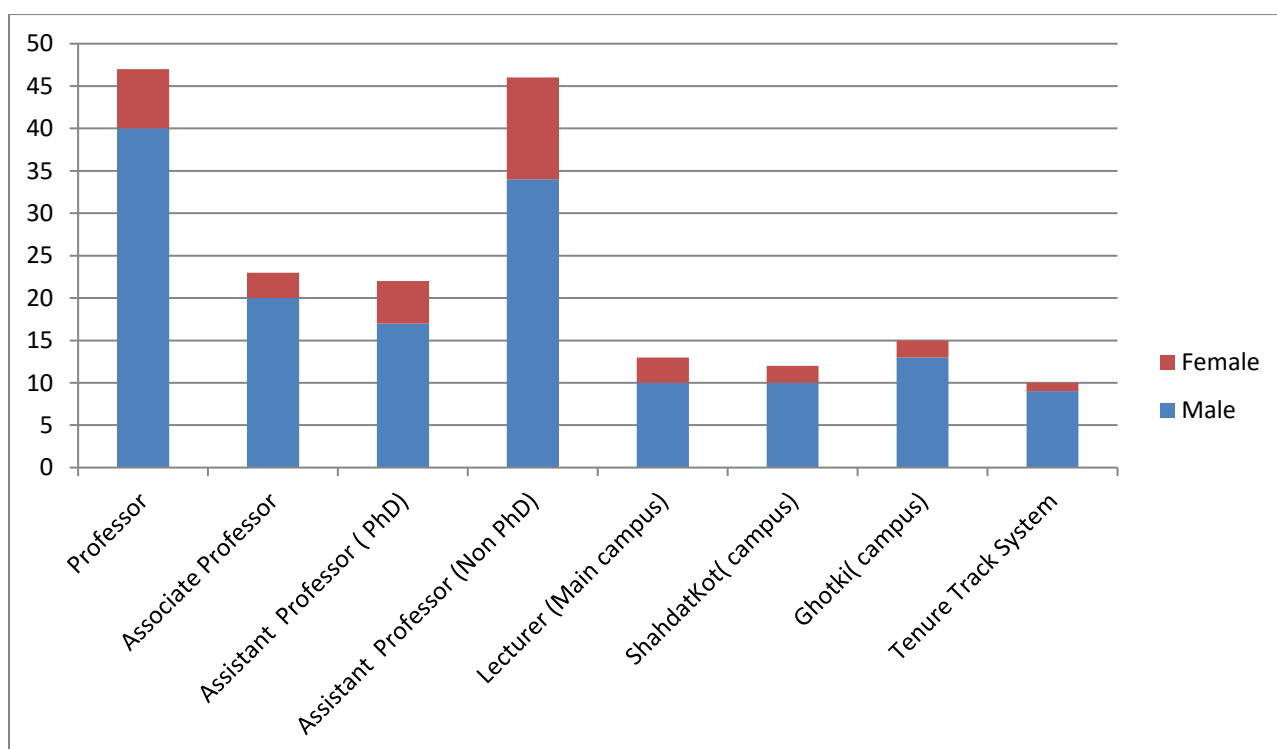
CHAPTER-1: ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

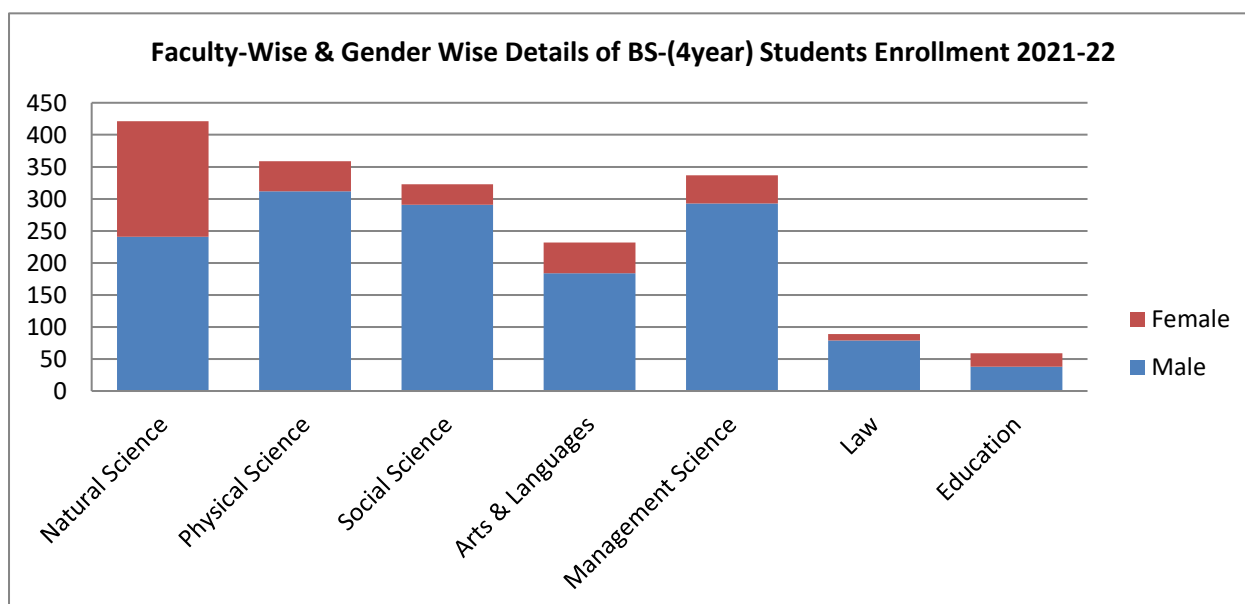

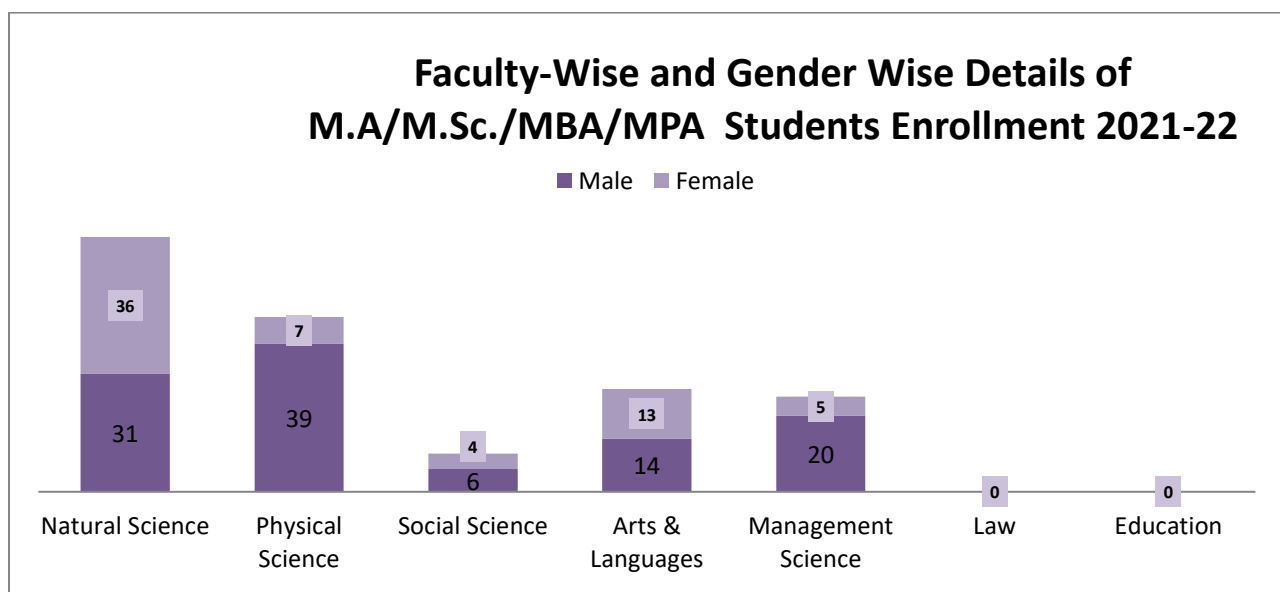

Faculty-Wise and Gender Wise Details of M.A/M.Sc./MBA/MPA Students Enrollment 2021-22

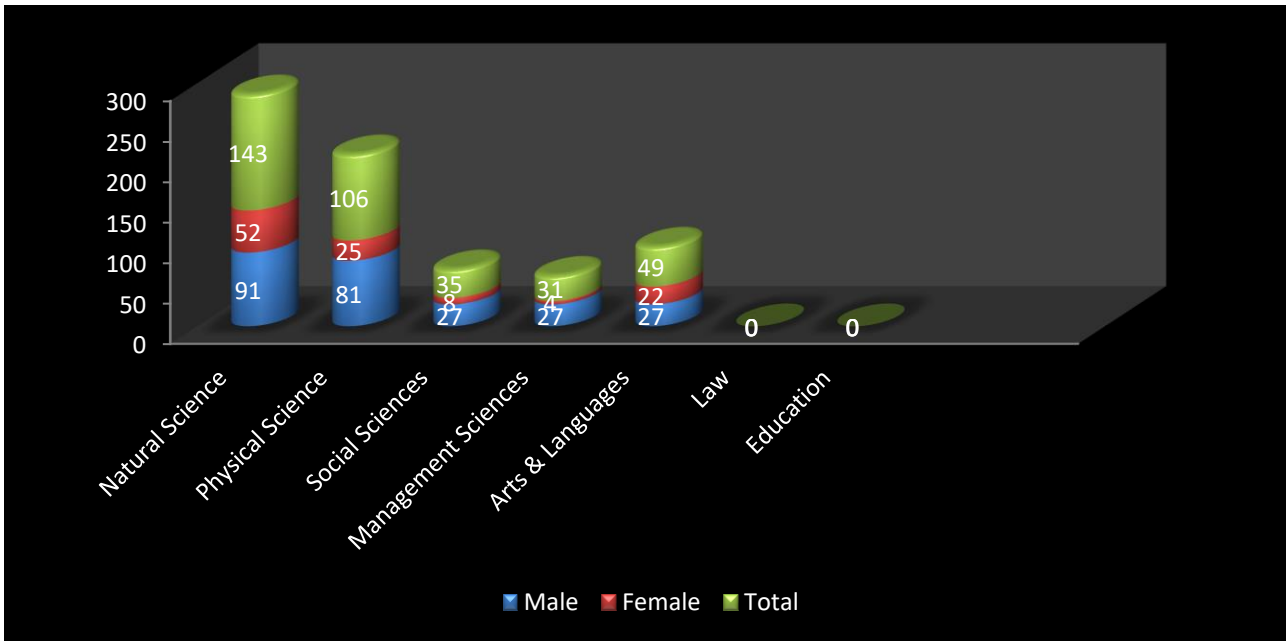

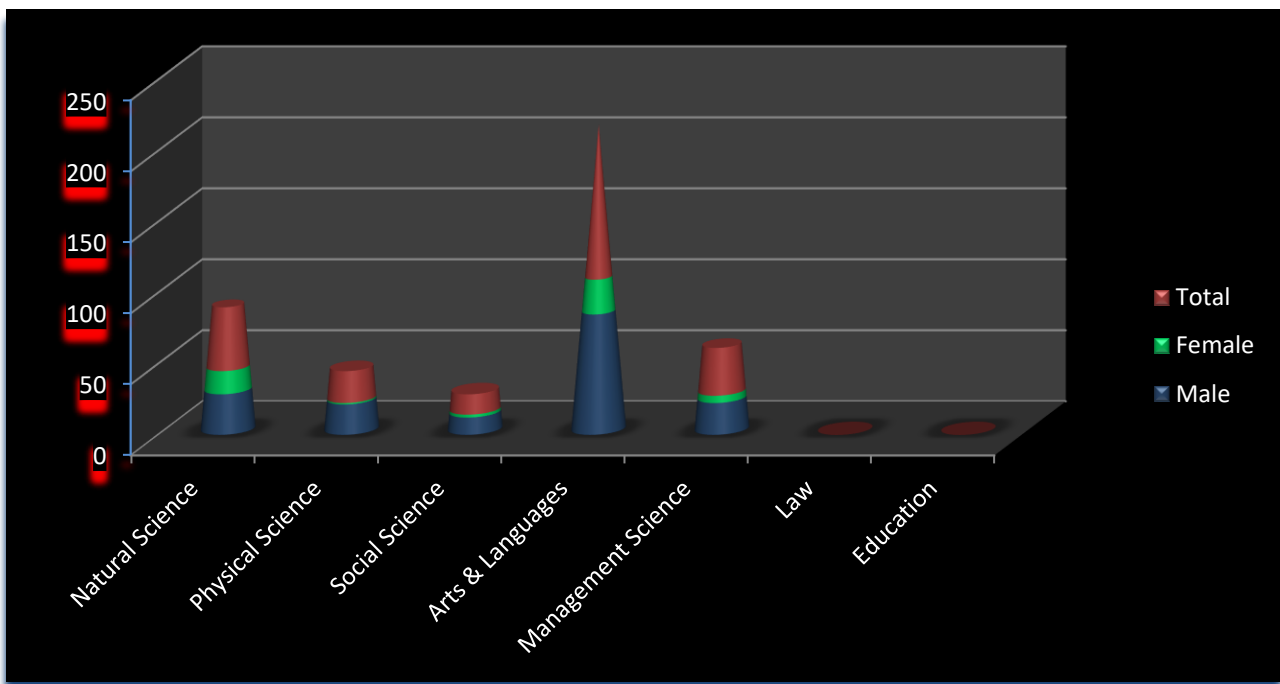

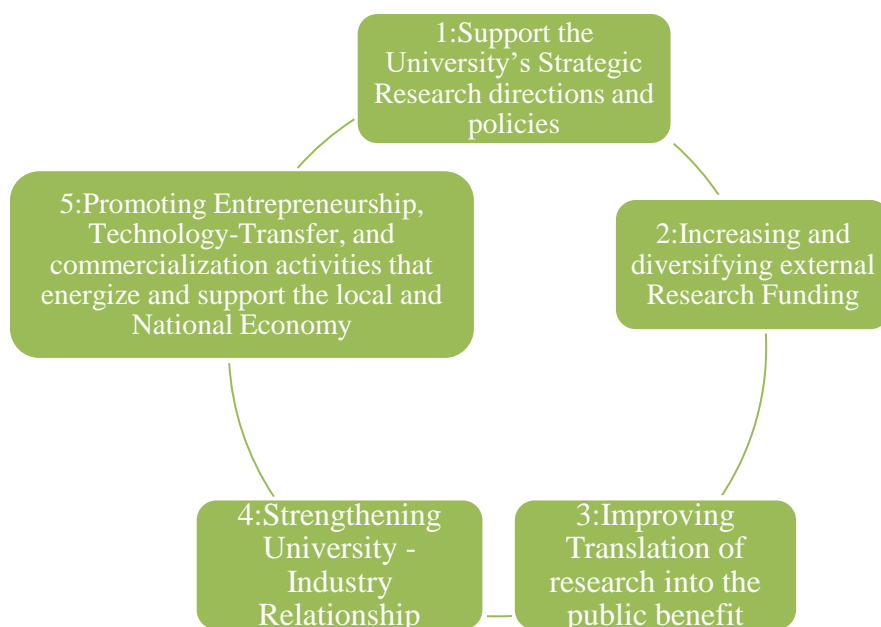

- ❖ Online feedback on different surveys (Teachers, Students, Course Evaluation, Research Student Progress Review form including Faculty resume), not only reduced the time spent for data collection, analysis, and report generation but also minimized finance and labor.
- ❖ The QEC assists to conduct Graduating Students Surveys, Alumni surveys and Employers survey to improve the quality of program offered under the guidance of all stakeholders. The reports of these surveys are communicated to departments and institutes concerned for the improvement of quality education.
- ❖ Regular capacity building of the teachers to improve teaching methodologies is focused through organizing different workshops and participating in various conferences, seminars and other academic activities on different forums.
- ❖ The QEC has initiated self-assessment process at very beginning in different programs offered by the departments and communicated all relevant documents to HEC as per assessment process.
- ❖ The QEC also works in collaboration with the ORIC regarding Turnitin software for plagiarism detection in scientific reports writing to improve the writing standards as per international requirements so that the old system of cut and paste is discouraged.
- ❖ Keeping in view the above mentioned objectives of the QEC, altogether 31 Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of BS/MA programs and 17 Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of MS/MPhil. programs have been completed. They said that soil erosion is a major environmental problem that is increasing year by year. It requires preventing political, economic and technical actions. They said that rapid urban growth is the component which has scribed to loss of agriculture land. They said that climate change changes the trend of stream flow in the cold regions and it is urgent to quantify its impact on the loss of glacier ice and water resources. They said that the mangroves make highly protective echo system. This echo system provides habitat to various wildlife. It is the need of the time to protect the

mangroves fields. They said that the global climate change is a posing serious threat to the world's agriculture that increased the risk of food security.

a) Ehsaas Undergraduate Scholarship Project

The Ehsaas Undergraduate Scholarship Project is available for deserving students of Shah Abdul latif University Khairpur, Main campus, Ghotki and Shahdadkot campus in academic session 2019-2020 and going on

By targeting most vulnerable segment of young population through this initiative, poorer households would be enabled to come out of poverty, which in a long run expected to have positive impact on individuals, their families and the community.

It is a paradigm shift in a policy of the Government of Pakistan to support undergraduate level students who are unable to pursue university education due to limited financial resources. The Ehsaas Undergraduate Scholarship Project focuses on 4-5year undergraduate programs, completes the bachelor's degree & covers university tuition fee and stipend throughout degree duration

It is one of the sizeable project funding under Government of Pakistan's Ehsaas social safety net program which aims to provide 50,000 undergraduate scholarships with an average budget of Rs.6 billion annually. Over a period of next four to five years these scholarships will be increased to around 200,000.

The project aims to support female education therefore 50% of scholarships are reserved for the female students in the overall Project's target. To encourage physically challenged students, 2% of the scholarships are reserved for them. Scholarships funds allocation is given below

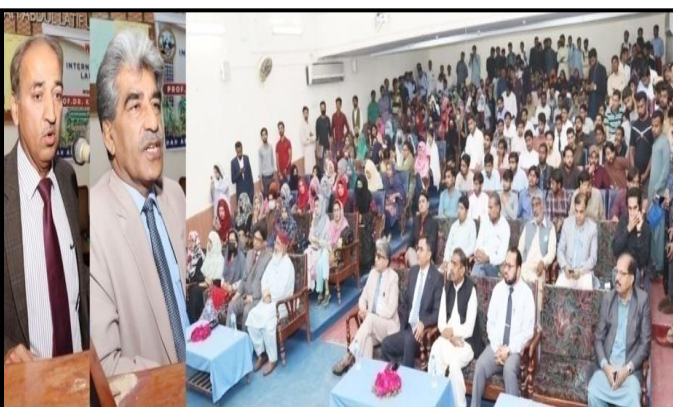

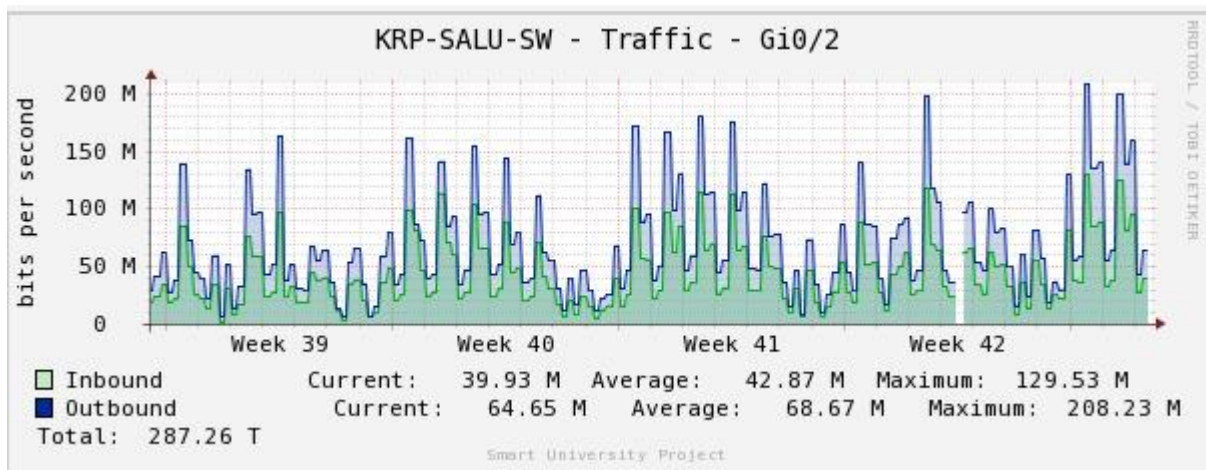
New website

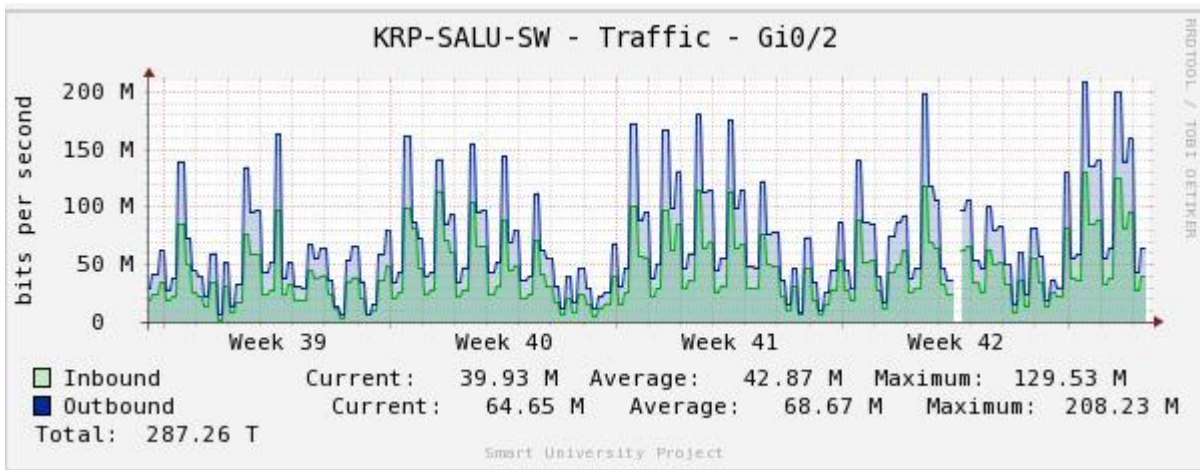

PERN Usage in University Main Campus



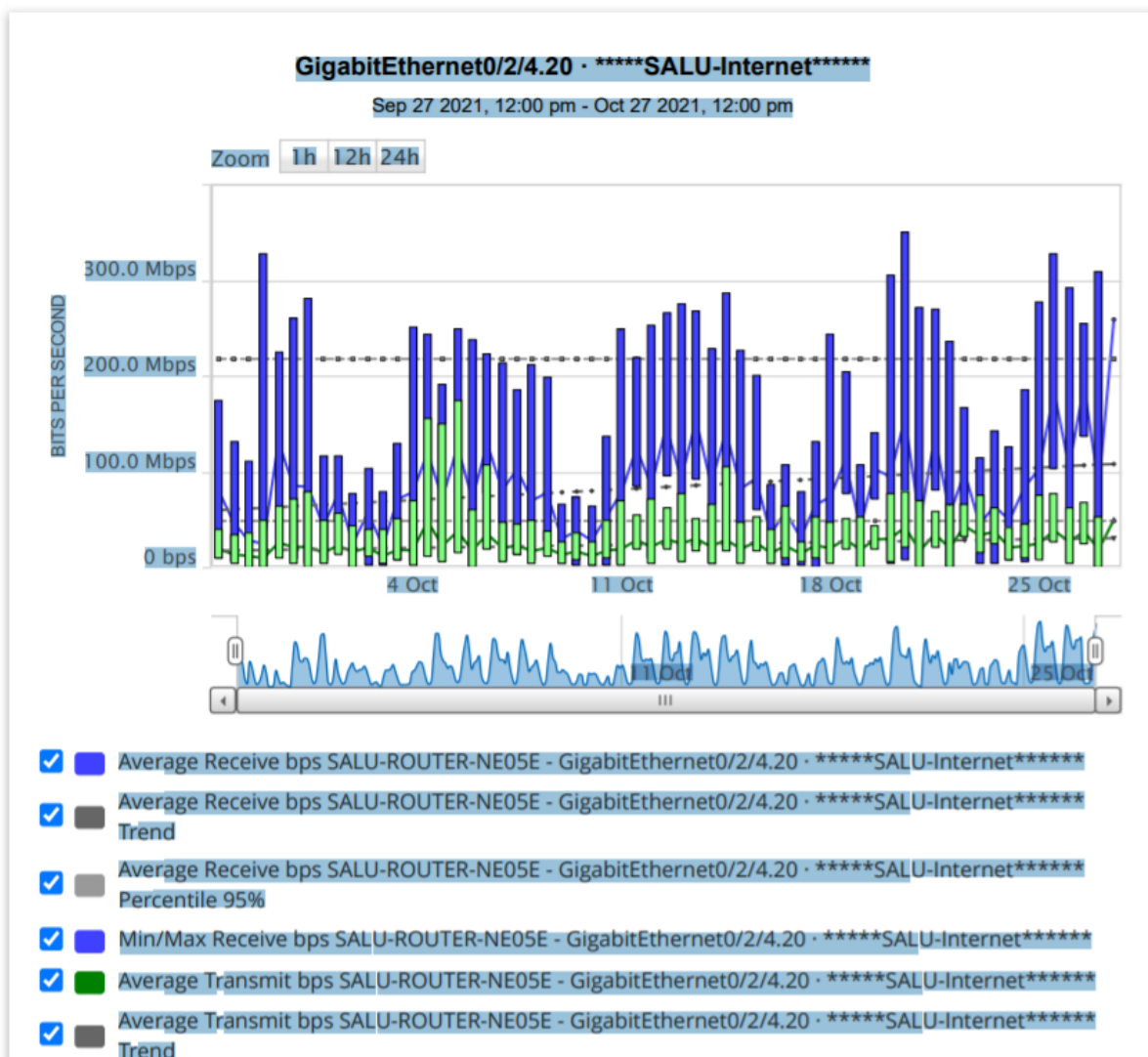
Smart WIFI/PERN Local Area Network

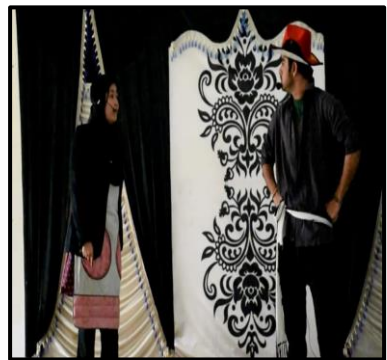
